














About the International Foundation Programme (IFP)

The BIBF International Foundation Programme (IFP) is the only programme of its kind in Bahrain that has been formally recognised by UK ENIC – the body responsible for determining the equivalence of qualifications in the UK – as equivalent to A Levels and the IB Diploma. The IFP allows participants to spend an extra year in their home country without losing their chances of joining a UK university of their choice for the degree programme. In fact, more than 21 UK universities have signed direct progression agreements with the BIBF, providing our students a place on selected courses at these universities. The list currently includes universities such as: Cardiff, Leeds, Reading, Warwick, and York and many others. The scope of the programme focuses on providing participants with the key verbal, numerical and study skills required for academic success in a wide range of degrees within the area of social sciences.

The International Foundation Programme aims to enable students holding a Bahrain High School diploma, or other qualifications below the standard entry requirement for a UK degree programme, to progress to their intended undergraduate degree. The programme consists of a number of subjects that are expected to equip learners with an introductory-level knowledge of specific topics related to economics, business, and finance; as well as the essential academic skills required to succeed in higher education, such as critical thinking, academic writing, and numeracy. The level of attainment is recognised against the UK's Qualifications and Curriculum Authority (QCA)'s 'A' level standard.








- Help students coming from different educational systems (public and private schools) to align their existing qualification to the UK education system and become eligible for admission.

Study Options:

After completing the International Foundation Programme, students can choose any of the following pathways:



Proceed to the undergraduate degree programmes offered at the BIBF in partnership with the Bangor University or the University of London.



Go to the UK and proceed to a relevant undergraduate programme.

Course Structure:

- · One academic required for year for completion
- Two semesters (from September January and from February June)
- · Four modules per semester
- · A combination of guided learning and self-study is required
- · Sessions are conducted in small groups allowing for maximum support and interaction
- · Access to online resources through "MyLabs"
- Additional academic support through "Peer Tutoring Scheme"
- · You will be assessed through a mixture of continuous assessment and written examinations
- · You will complete group projects, presentations, individual essays, and problem-solving exercises

The Units at a Glance

Semester I

Emerging Business Trends:

This module provides students with a basic understanding of the business environment, emerging business trends and ethical and social responsibility concepts. It will focus on introducing the students to entrepreneurship, managing and organising business, employee behaviour, and motivation.

Academic Study Skills:

This unit focuses on a number of topics including understanding yourself as a learner, study techniques, academic reading and writing, academic integrity and avoiding plagiarism.

Business English:

This unit is designed to ensure that students have the necessary English language skills, both receptive and productive, to be able to proceed effectively and with confidence in an English medium academic environment.

Introduction to Mathematics for Business & Finance I:

The aim is to provide students with a knowledge of mathematical tools and techniques required to solve business-related problems. This module focuses on numerical skills students will need at the next levels of study. The unit focuses on a number of topics including working with numbers, algebra, linear equations, and probability.





The Units at a Glance

Semester 2

Principles of Accounting:

This module covers the basic principles of the theory and practice of Financial Accounting, Management Accounting and Financial Management, both for non-specialist students and as a foundation for further study in the area. It covers the basic principles and underlying concepts and the ways in which accounting statements and financial information can be used to improve the quality of decision-making.

Introduction to Economics:

This unit provides students with a more general introduction to the concepts and principles of economics, in preparation for the more specialised introductory microeconomics and macroeconomics modules taken during Year One in university. The topics covered in the unit include subjects like Economic Problems, Market Structures, Data of Macroeconomics and Money, and Monetary Systems. Apart from that, students will attend simulation sessions at the BIBF's Dealing Room. The simulation activities will allow students to enhance their understanding of the interaction between macroeconomics, interest rates as well as the demand and supply of money.

Introduction to Statistics:


This is intended towards developing the statistical skills students will need to progress to the next levels. The unit focuses on a number of topics including descriptive statistics, inferential statistics, variables, and index numbers.


Academic Writing & Presentation Skills:

This is to ensure that students have the ability to produce academic work such as essays, projects, and presentations of satisfactory quality, and to develop and encourage a proactive, independent approach to academic study. During this unit you will take a journey through the different stages related to writing an extended research paper starting from finding a topic to presenting your findings to an audience.





According to a recent survey (2021), about 66% of the **BIBF's** graduates are employed within 3 months after graduation.

Employability

The BIBF's academic programmes are developed in collaboration with the best-inclass international universities and are recognised by the Bahrain Higher Education Council (HEC). A true testament to the BIBF's efforts in ensuring that these academic programmes are a best fit for the labour market is reflected in the BIBF's employability statistics over the years.

Our recent undergraduate destination survey of 2021 indicates that 66% of the BIBF's Graduates are employed within 3 months after graduation, 89% of our graduates have been employed within 12 months of their graduation. The survey also indicates that most of our graduates are likely to be employed within their fields of Banking & Finance or Accounting & Finance, mainly in banks and auditing firms.
