Q

What are the entry requirements

Economics and Management:

- Completion of the BIBF International Foundation Programme

Or higher diploma such as:

International Baccalaureate (IB)

“The Diploma” with at least 24 points and a pass in Mathematics (AA or AI) with grade 3 or above at Higher Level or Standard Level.

Or 3 GCSE/GCE O level passes (including English & Mathematics) at grade C or above plus 2 GCE A level passes at grade E or above.

Or CBSE/CISCE/NIOS: 4 subjects passed with overall average of 70% and a pass in Mathematics with at least 50%.

Or A completed BTEC Level 3 are equivalent to UK GCE A Levels. with Mathematics to UK GCSE Level (Grade 4) or equivalent

- (IELTS UK VI or IELTS Academic overall score of 6.0 with no band less than 5.5)

What are the entry requirements

Data Science and Business Analytics:

- Sitting a Mathematics entry assessment regardless of whether higher diploma holder or not (results will be shared with UoL for approval)
- The successful completion of the BIBF International Foundation programme and achieving an overall of 85% as well as (90% in both the STA100 and MAT100 at the Foundation Year)
- Full IB (24 Point minimum – IB Math 5-7)
- A-Levels (BCC)
- (IELTS UK VI or IELTS Academic overall score of 6.0 with no band less than 5.5)

What does the assessment and grading process involve?

- Each module would include one final exam accounting for 100% of all grades
- DSBA Y2 modules (some would have a 30% bearing assignment and a 70% bearing final exam)
- The BIBF would be conducting mock assessments as a tool to prepare students for their final exams but do not account towards their final grade.
- Passing final exams is out of 40%

Will I have the option to study abroad?

- No, students study all year at the BIBF
- Some students achieve high academic merits and are invited to complete a summer school in UoL (not an annual procedure)

How much would the full programme cost?

A

Tuition fee has 2 payment structures. (one paid to the BIBF while another paid to the University of London directly)

BIBF fees:

- Year 1: BHD 4000/-
- Year 2: BHD 4000/-
- Year 3: BHD 4,000)
- One-off BHD 100/- booking fee
- BHD 30/- Application fee

UoL 3rd Party Fees:

- BHD 1,500/- annually (and increases by 10% each year)
